

## **Before Starting the Project Listings for the CoC Priority Listing**

**The CoC Consolidated Application requires TWO submissions. Both this Project Priority Listing AND the CoC Application MUST be completed and submitted prior to the submission deadline stated in the Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness Special NOFO.**

The CoC Priority Listing includes:

- Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside New Project Listing – lists all new project applications applying for funding through the Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside that were approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- Rural Set Aside Project Listing – lists all new project applications applying for funding through the Rural Set Aside that were approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- UFA Costs Project Listing – applicable and only visible for Collaborative Applicants that were designated as a Unified Funding Agency (UFA) during the FY 2022 CoC Program Registration process. Only 1 UFA Costs project application is permitted and must be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant. The UFA project must be ranked amongst projects submitted on the Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside New Project Listing.
- CoC Planning Project Listing – Only 1 CoC planning project is permitted per CoC and must be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant. The CoC Planning project must be ranked amongst projects submitted on the Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside New Project Listing.
- HUD-2991, Certification of Consistency with the Consolidated Plan – Collaborative Applicants must attach an accurately completed, signed, and dated HUD-2991.

Things to Remember:

- All projects must be approved and ranked or rejected on the Project Listings. This includes funding for CoC Planning and UFA Costs, which must be ranked amongst projects submitted on the Unsheltered Homelessness Set Aside New Project Listing.
- Collaborative Applicants are responsible for ensuring all project applications accurately appear on the Project Listings and there are no project applications missing from one or more Project Listings.
- If a project application(s) is rejected by the CoC, the Collaborative Applicant must notify the project applicant(s) no later than 15 days before the CoC Program Competition application deadline outside of e-snaps and include the reason for rejection.
- For each project application rejected by the CoC the Collaborative Applicant must select the reason for the rejection from the dropdown provided.
- If the Collaborative Applicant needs to amend a project application for any reason after ranking has been completed, the ranking of other projects will not be affected; however, the Collaborative Applicant MUST ensure the amended project is returned to the applicable Project Listing AND re-rank the project application BEFORE submitting the CoC Priority Listing to HUD in e-snaps.

# Unsheltered Project Selection

## Unsheltered Homelessness

The Will County Continuum of Care (CoC) is dedicated to addressing homelessness among our communities most vulnerable members- those experiencing unsheltered homelessness. The CoC is working to develop an infrastructure that allows the system to reach those experiencing unsheltered homelessness. It will take dedicated outreach, housing, and services, to ensure that no one experiences unsheltered homelessness in our communities.

## Summary

The Will County Continuum of Care completed the Project Review and Selection process October 3, 2022. Four projects were considered for the SNOFO Project Priority Listing: 1 Supportive Services Only, 1 Rapid Rehousing, 1 Permanent Supportive Housing (Scattered Site), and 1 Permanent Supportive Housing (Site-Based). All four projects that requested funding are recommended by the Ranking Committee to be included in the SNOFO application.

Approximately \$322,000,000, with \$267,500,000 dedicated to unsheltered homelessness, in funding is available in US Department of Housing and Urban Development- the Special Notice of Funding Opportunity (SNOFO) to Address Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness.

The National Alliance to End Homelessness shares, “CoCs will be selected for funding, including all rated and ranked projects that pass threshold until funding runs out. CoCs must demonstrate a comprehensive, coordinated approach to reducing unsheltered homelessness. This approach should be grounded in Housing First and public health principles. This includes improving service engagement, health outcomes, and housing stability among highly vulnerable unsheltered individuals and families.”

The total amount the Will County Continuum of Care can apply for in the SNOFO is \$2,388,585- or \$796,195 annually. The initial grant term for all projects is 3 years.

The Ranking Committee recommends the portfolio of projects in this document to be selected for our communities’ application of the Special NOFO to Address Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness.

# Unsheltered Project Selection

### Will County CoC's Initiative to Support Leaders with Lived Experience

The Will County CoC believes that leaders with lived experience play an important role in our work. It is equitable to ensure that resources are available to provide compensation for their contributions in planning, implementation, and evaluation to the projects awarded under the Special NOFO. Each awardee has been allocated \$5000 to contribute to the CoC's work to support leaders of lived experience.

#### *Goals-*

- Each project helps identify at least one leader with lived experience to serve on the Ending Unsheltered Homelessness working group.
- Projects will work as a part of a cohort to ensure that working group participants are provided support so that they can participate in overall program management, coordination, monitoring, and evaluation. These services may be performed under third-party contracts or agreements.
- Projects provide compensation to their work group members.
- Projects may provide their work group members formal trainings.

### Conclusion:

The Will County Continuum of Care is committed to responding to the crisis of homelessness through Housing First and Progressive Engagement. Those who are in a housing crisis should have access to rapid housing solutions that meet their needs, especially those exasperated by their homeless crisis. Unsheltered homelessness demonstrates a lack of system capacity. The SNOFO allows the CoC to dedicate resources to ending unsheltered homelessness. The SNOFO Project Portfolio will enable the Will County Continuum of Care to strengthen its housing and services infrastructure moving the community closer to ending homelessness.
